





STAND OR COMPROMISE?

A TEACH & PLAY LESSON · TRUTH IN LOVE · 1 COR. 6:11

*"And such were some of you. But you were **washed**, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ." — 1 Corinthians 6:11*

The game was loud. This part is just for you. Be honest — no one else reads this.

1. Right now, standing on Scripture while loving people feels... *(circle one)*

- CLEAR — I know God's design and I want to love without hate
-  PRESSURED — culture says speaking up makes me a bad person
-  CONFUSED or ASHAMED — I need hope, not a label

2. The pressure I hear most often is...

- "Love means approving everything" "The Bible is outdated"
- "Stay quiet so nobody calls you hateful" "Your feelings define who you are"

3. Truth in love, according to today's lesson, means... *(check any)*

- Stand on God's Word — marriage is one man and one woman (Gen. 2:24)
- Love people — don't mock, bully, or celebrate their pain (Rom. 12:21)
- Hope in Christ — change is possible; shame isn't the last word (1 Cor. 6:11)

4. Tonight I'm choosing... *(circle)*

- ▶ To stand on Scripture — even when the crowd wants compromise
- ▶ To love people kindly — without bending truth to fit culture
- ▶ To flee sexual immorality and ask a leader for help if I'm struggling (1 Cor. 6:18)

5. My prayer, in my own words:

"God — You are holy and loving. Help me stand on Your Word without hating anyone. When culture pressures me to compromise, give me courage. If I'm confused or ashamed, wash me clean in Christ and remind me change is possible. Teach me to love people and not bend truth to fit the crowd. I'm Yours."

Love people — don't bend truth to fit the culture.
